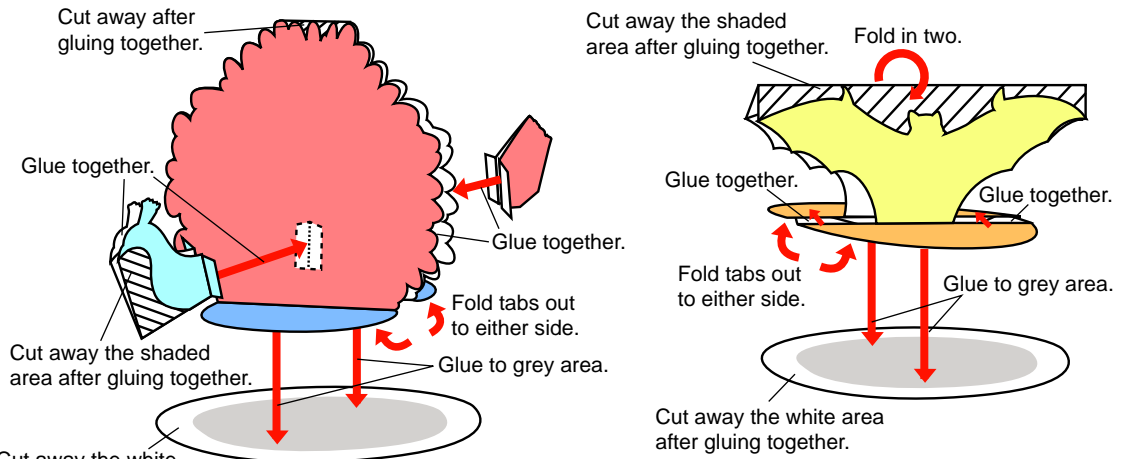


The vast continent of Asia is covered with everything from lush greenery to deserts, and is home to a wide variety of plants and animals.

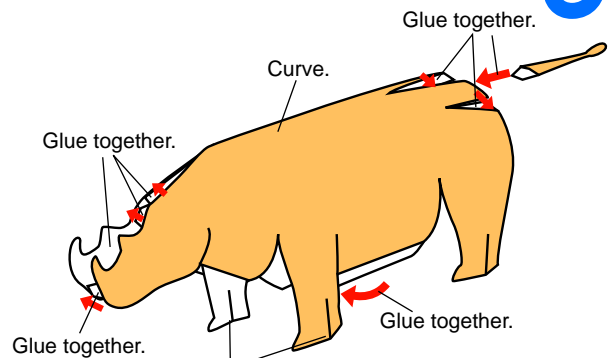
Cut away the white area after gluing together.

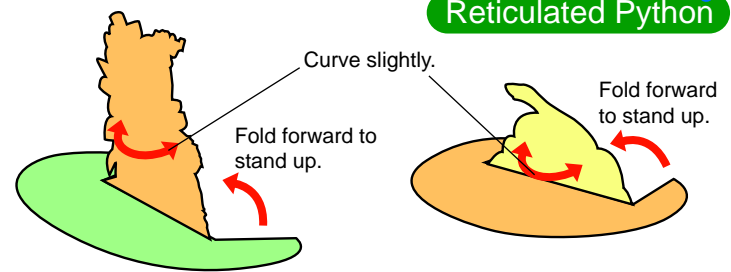

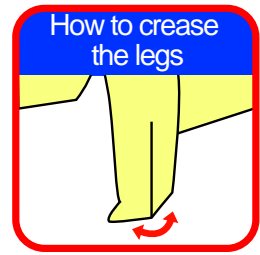
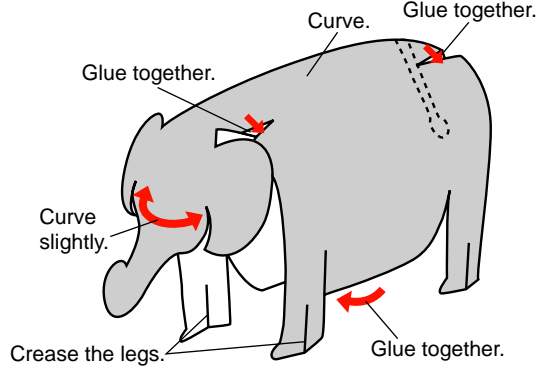

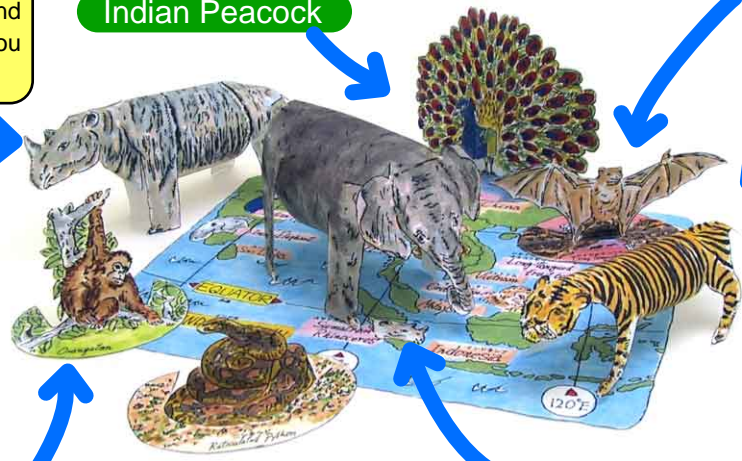


Reticulated Python

Crease the animals' legs to give them a bit of a curve, as shown. This will strengthen the legs and allow the animals to stand up well.

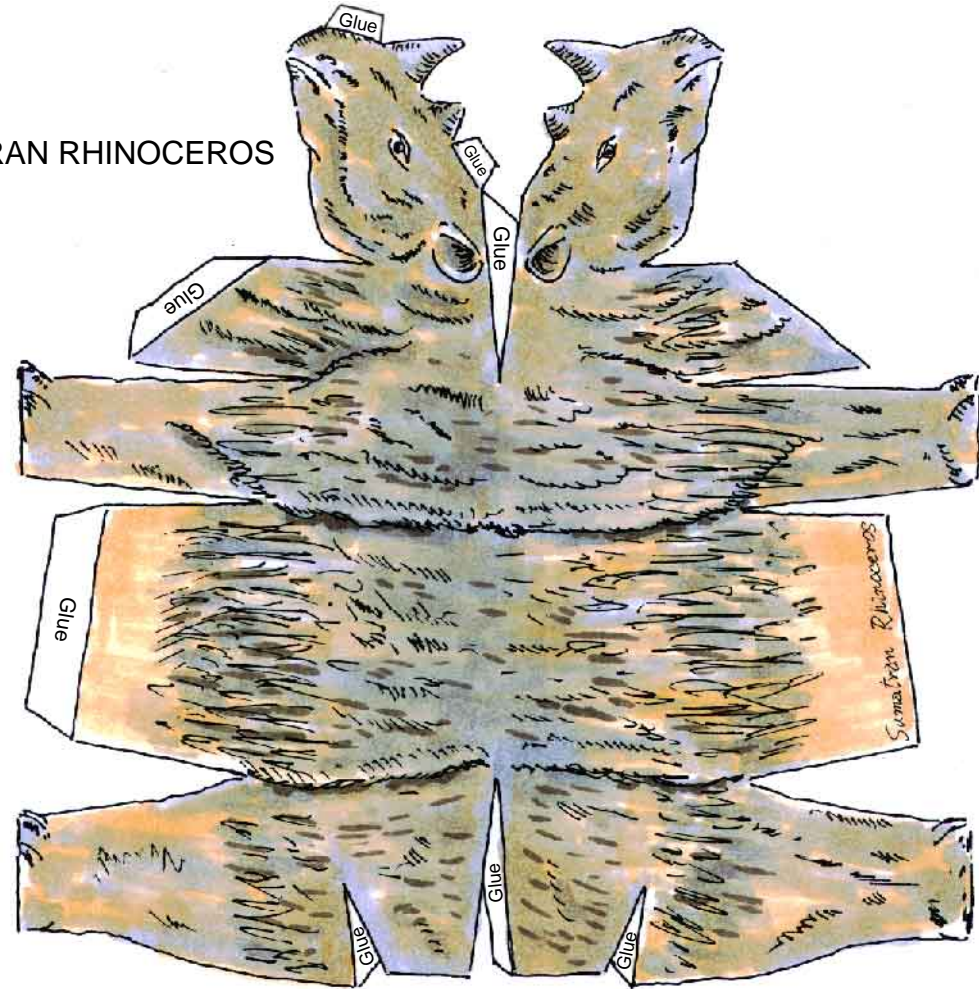

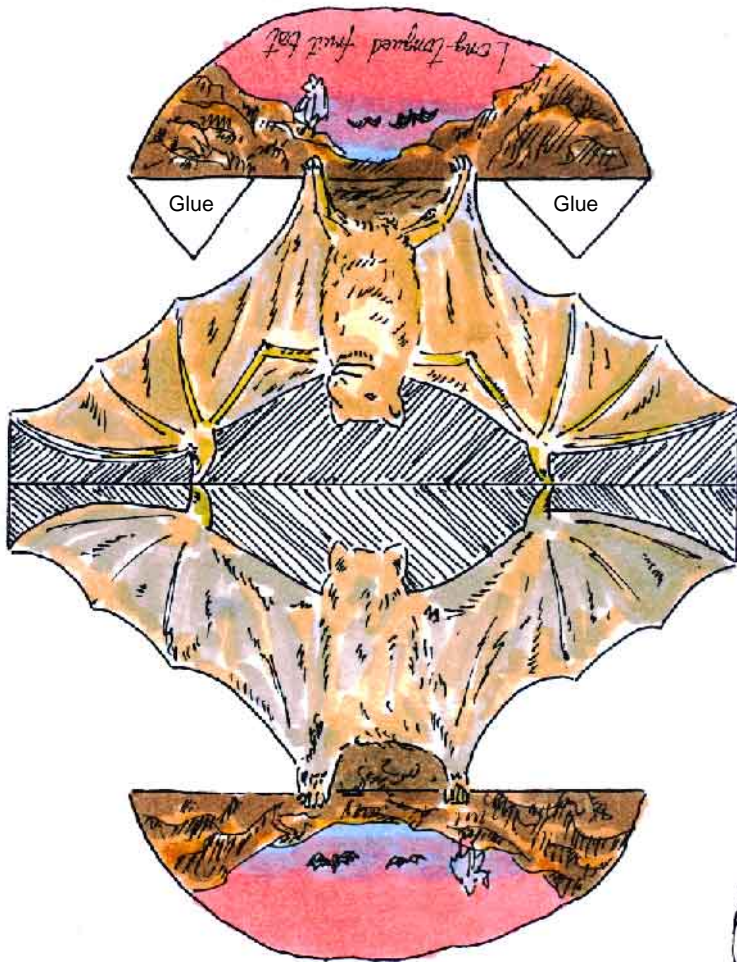

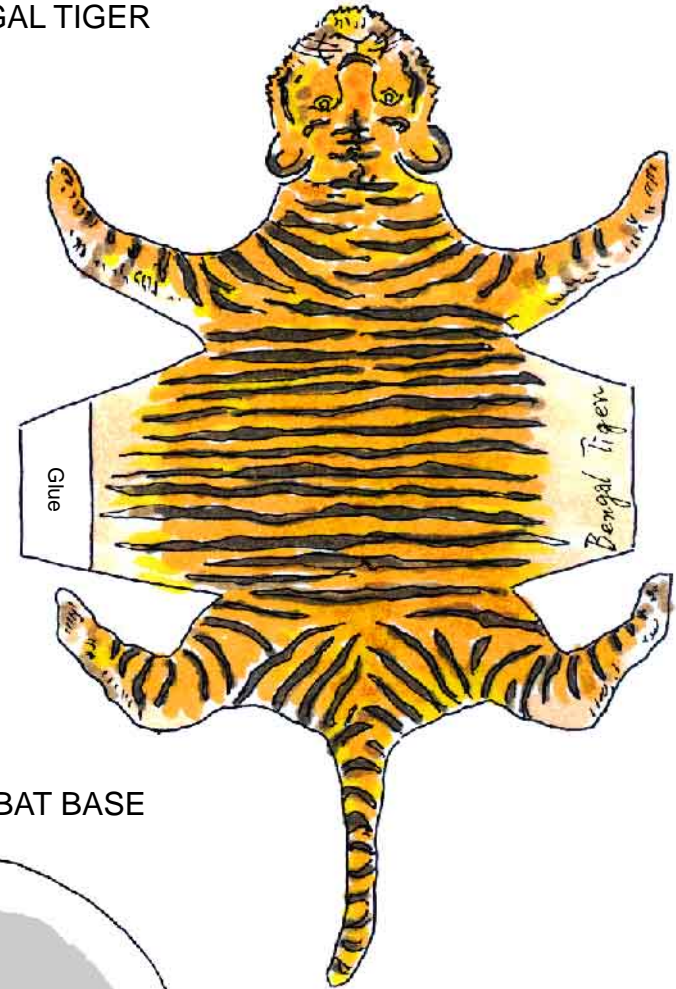
SUMATRAN RHINOCEROS TAIL



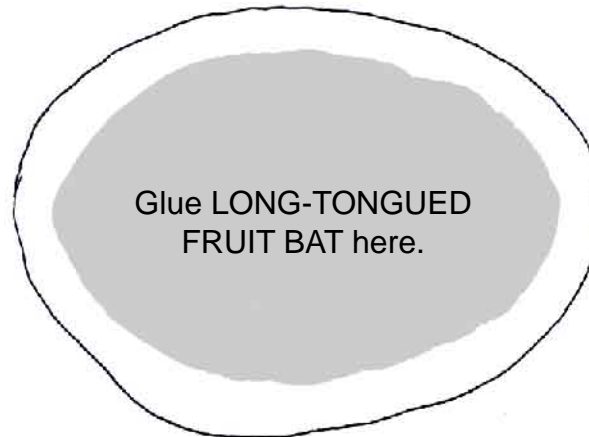

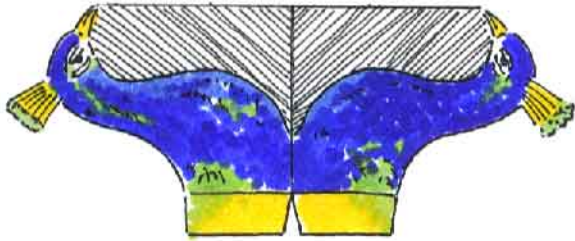

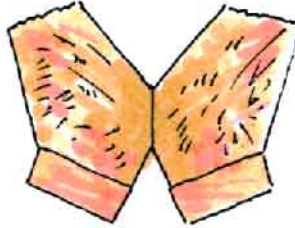
LONG-TONGUED FRUIT BAT BASE



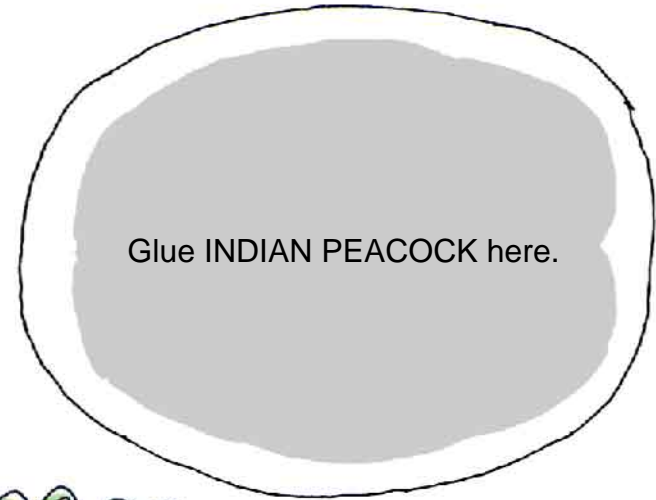

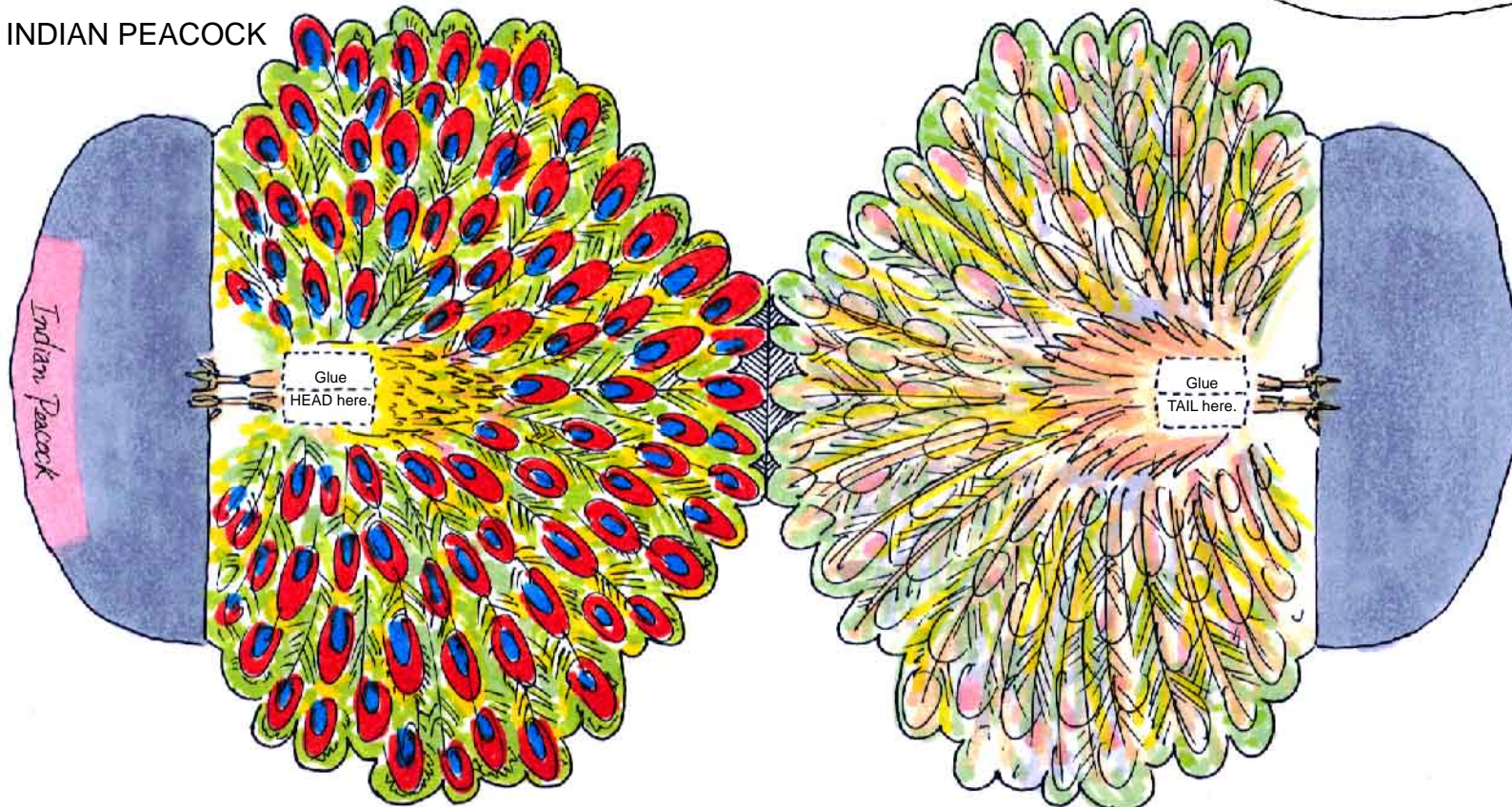


INDIAN PEACOCK BASE

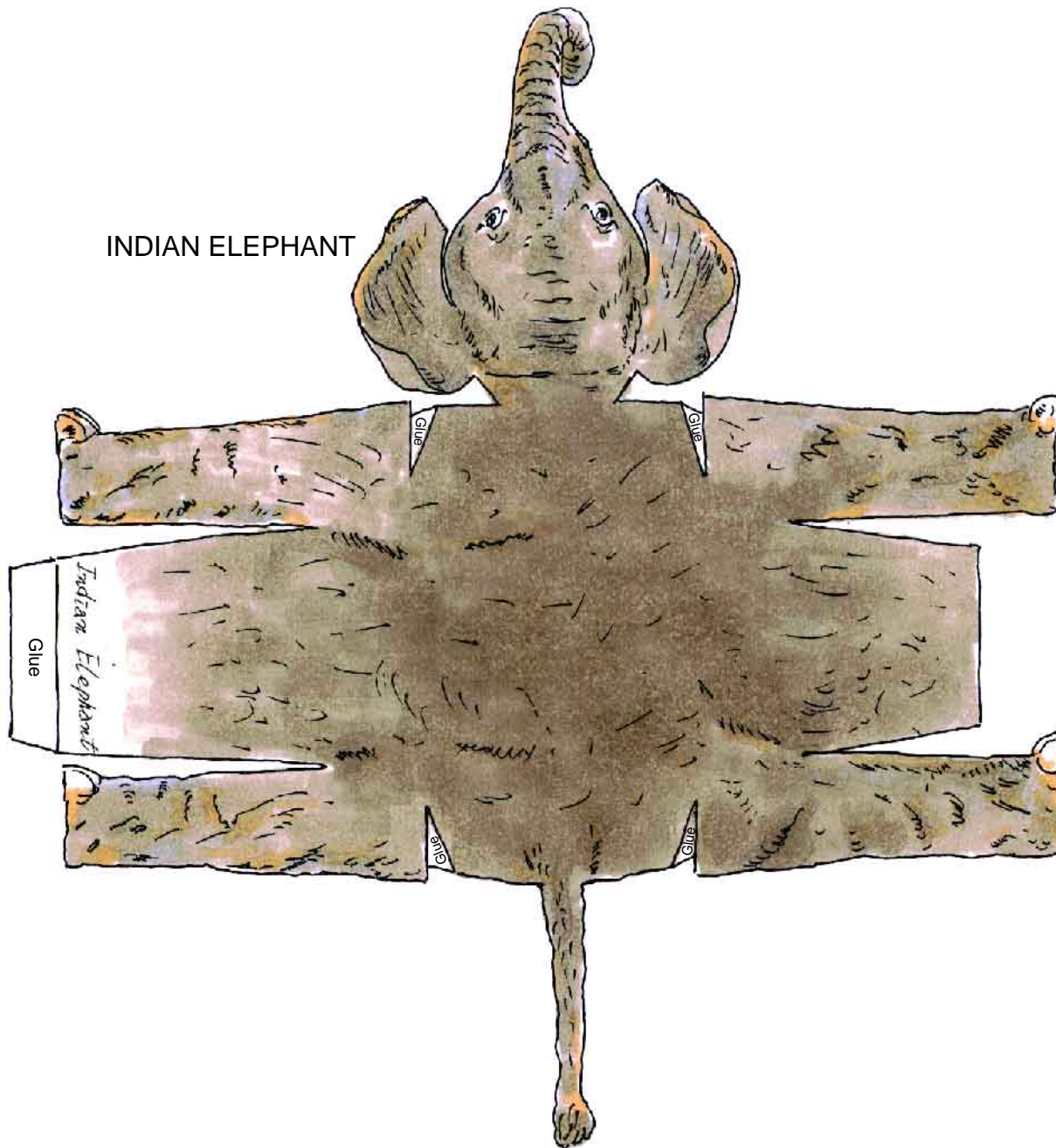


Glue INDIAN PEACOCK here.
